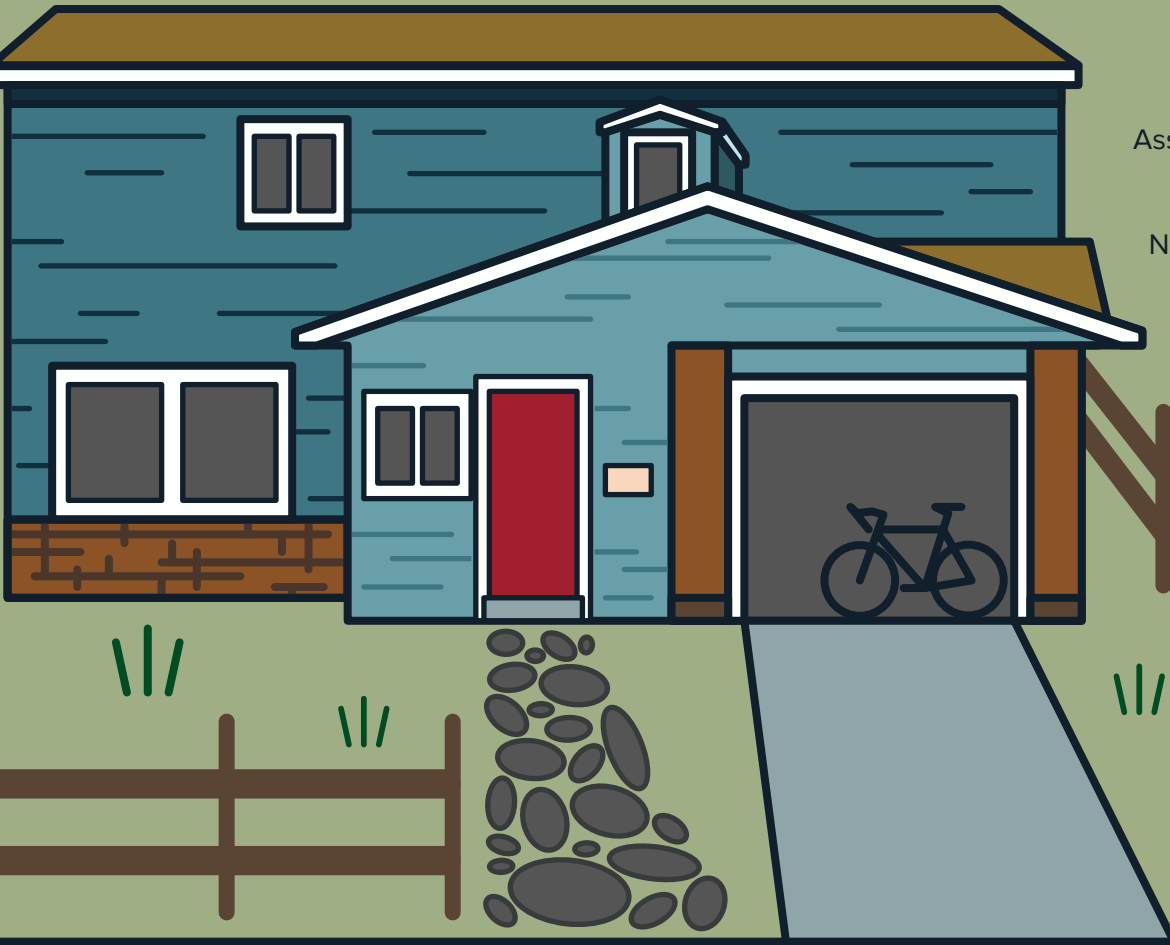

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR

Being a good neighbor is a responsibility we all hold. Good neighboring is one of the many things that makes Fort Collins such a great community. Getting to know your neighbors early means you are more likely to solve concerns or issues with one another, rather than depending on a third party (i.e. police). Here are a few key tips to good neighboring:

INTRODUCE YOURSELF

A simple "hello" goes a long way. This is the first step in building a good relationship. And don't forget to keep saying "hello." Grow the relationship throughout the year; you never know when you will need some help.

KEEP NEIGHBORS INFORMED

Contact your neighbors in advance before undertaking something that may affect them, like throwing a party, building a fence, or getting a dog. Share contact information (cell phone, email, etc. – the one you check and will answer) so there is an easy way of communicating during any event you might host or if other questions arise.

BE AWARE OF NEIGHBORHOOD EXPECTATIONS & CITY ORDINANCES

Be aware of not only the local laws and ordinances, but also your neighborhood's rules. Every neighborhood, home owner's association, or apartment complex has its own set of additional policies/rules. As you get to know your neighbors, ask them about expectations of residents.

RESPECT DIFFERENCES

Age, faith, ethnicity, and family status are just some of the things that make us different and have an impact on how we go about our daily lives. Be aware and respectful of differences between you and your neighbors.

ASK HOW YOU CAN HELP

Neighborly gestures contribute to a positive and welcoming neighborhood for all. Shoveling snow for your neighbor who may need assistance is a welcomed gesture and can come back tenfold when you need help.

BE ASSERTIVE

If your neighbor does something that bothers you, respectfully let them know as soon as possible. If you cannot work out a fair compromise, take advantage of the free and confidential mediation services offered by the City of Fort Collins Community Mediation Program (970) 224-6022. If you are a CSU Student, you can access these services through Conflict Resolution Services at the Student Resolution Center: (970) 491-7165.

NEIGHBORHOOD LIVABILITY

TRASH/WEEDS/OUTDOOR STORAGE

- No furniture designed for indoor use can be placed in your yard or on an unenclosed porch.
- Weeds and grass cannot exceed a height of 6" in yards or alleys or 12" in fields or undeveloped lots.
- Trash must be stored out of sight in plastic/metal cans with tight-fitting lids or in sealed plastic bags, cannot be left out for more than 12 hours before or after trash collection, and cannot interfere with pedestrians, bicyclists, or vehicles.

SNOW REMOVAL

- Sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 24 hours of accumulation. Failure to do so will result in you paying for the City to shovel.

PETS

- Legally permitted pets must be licensed, vaccinated, and leashed if they are not confined to your yard.
- If a dog is barking uncontrollably, call Animal Control at (970) 226-3647 ext. 7.
- Complaints about animal waste can be directed to Animal Control.

OCCUPANCY & RENTAL STANDARDS

- The Occupancy Ordinance, known as the "U+2" ordinance, states: Occupancy in a residential dwelling unit (single-family, duplex, and multi-family) is restricted to:
 - 3 unrelated persons OR
 - 1 family and 1 additional person
- Basic elements necessary for safe housing include adequate heating facilities, safe electrical systems, emergency exits, and both smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. For more, visit: www.fcgov.com/building/pdf/rental-brochure.pdf

PARKING & STORING VEHICLES

- Vehicles must park facing the correct direction, cannot block driveways or sidewalks, and must be moved every 48 hours.
- Trailers of any kind cannot be stored on the street.
- Vehicles, including trailers and campers, may not park on yards. This includes during CSU stadium events. To report, call the Nuisance Hotline at: (970) 416-2200.
- Inoperable vehicles, not currently licensed or incapable of operating, may not be stored in public view.
- To report any of these violations, call Fort Collins Police Services at (970) 419-3273.

UNWANTED NEWSPAPERS

- Directions to unsubscribe are on the front of the paper. Do not let them accumulate on your property.

TRANSPORTATION

EXPANDED TRANSFORT SERVICE

- 365-day Service: Transfort is now offering bus service on Sundays, including MAX and 5 other routes.
- Evening Service: Transfort has additional evening service routes in the campus west area. Riders can catch a bus as late as 10:30pm.
- Gold Route: The Gold Route is a late-night service that runs Friday and Saturday from 10:30pm-2:30am around Old Town and Campus West.
- Around the Horn: The Around the Horn route will now offer service to the southern residence halls.
- Zipcar: Car share that offers car rental by the hour. Visit www.zipcar.com to sign up.
- Bustang: Connects commuters and travelers to and from Denver, Colorado Springs, Fort Collins, Vail, Glenwood Springs and more. Visit www.ridebustang.com.

CAMPUS & COMMUNITY WHAT TO KNOW

PARTY SMART

- **Discuss Party Expectations:** Things such as date, time, guests, clean-up, sober host, etc.
- **Notify Neighbors in Advance:** Provide them your name and contact information -- the email or phone number you will be checking throughout the evening.
- **Designate a Sober Host** to monitor and control noise, outside disturbances, interactions with neighbors and police.
- **Think Before You Post:** Social media can spread word of your party further than you might anticipate. You are responsible for your guests' actions.
- **Keep the Size Reasonable:** More people means more noise and a greater chance for a costly citation.
- **Be Proactive:** If you're uncomfortable with the size of your party and/or people are not leaving despite your requests, call Fort Collins Police Services at (970) 419-3273 for assistance.
- **Be Cooperative** towards neighbors, police, and others who come to discuss issues from your party. Your interaction with police can have an impact on the type of citation and consequences.
- **Clean Up** after your party and check in with your neighbors. They may be more tolerant of your next party if they see you respecting the neighborhood.
- **Register Your Party:** Party Registration is available for any party year-round. By registering your party, you may receive a warning from Fort Collins Police Services Dispatch if there are complaints or concerns about noise. If you break up your party within 20 minutes of being notified, you may avoid a visit from police and a \$1,000+ noise citation and criminal misdemeanor. This program is not a guarantee that a citation won't be issued. In order to be eligible you must register by the Thursday before your party.
- **Grab a FREE Party Pack:** CSU students can come to Off-Campus Life and get a Party Pack, which includes party smart tips, neighbor notices, a water bottle, trash bags, and more!

All CSU students can register at Off-Campus Life. All other residents in Fort Collins can register at Neighborhood Services or Campus West Connections. Visit www.offcampuslife.colostate.edu for more information.

YOU NEED TO KNOW

NUISANCE GATHERING ORDINANCE

- Holds party host(s) accountable for behaviors, on and off the property, around trash and litter, public urination, underage drinking, vandalism, etc.
- Holds party host(s) accountable for property damage as a result of the gathering.
- Criminal misdemeanor, fine of \$1,000+, potential cost of damages, and more.

UNREASONABLE NOISE ORDINANCE

- The Unreasonable Noise Ordinance is in effect 24 hours a day. Combination of time of day, day of week, type of noise, and level of noise determine if it's too loud.
- Criminal misdemeanor, fine of \$1,000+, and more.

SOCIAL HOST ORDINANCE

- Holds host(s) responsible for providing a space in which underage possession/consumption of alcohol or marijuana is occurring.
- Host does not have to provide the alcohol/marijuana to be held responsible.
- Civil infraction, \$100+ fine.

RIOT

- Public disturbance involving 3+ people plus property damage.
- Watching a riot is considered engaging in one.
- Felony, costly fines, possible jail time.
- Cannot attend a Colorado public college/university for at least one year if convicted.

ALCOHOL

- Fort Collins has a strict open container law, even for those 21+.
- It is illegal to sell alcohol without a license; this includes selling cups at a keg party or taking donations. Providing alcohol to minors:
- If the minor is over 18 but under 21, it is a criminal misdemeanor with penalties of up to 18 months in prison and a \$5,000 fine.
- If a minor is under 18, the crime is a felony punishable by up to 6 years in prison and a \$500,000 fine.

MARIJUANA

- Colorado law permits those who are 21+ to use recreational marijuana within a private residence.
- It is NOT LEGAL to consume marijuana in public, sell or transfer to persons under the age of 21, drive under the influence, or possess more than one ounce.
- The use and possession of marijuana is prohibited on all CSU property, regardless of age.

TOBACCO AND ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES

- CSU: Smoking on any CSU property is prohibited in designated No Smoking Areas.
- City: In addition to restaurants and bars, smoking is prohibited in Old Town, all City parks, trails, natural areas, festivals, and several other locations.

TELL SOMEONE

If you are concerned about a student OR an employee, *Tell Someone*.

Call (970) 491-1350 to discuss concerns about any member of the CSU community, or use the Online Referral Form.

Referrals will be made to campus resources that can develop strategies and use resources to discreetly help students and employees who may be in distress.

If you believe a member of the campus community is in imminent danger to themselves or others, immediately contact CSU police by calling 911 or the department's non-emergency number at (970) 491-6425.

DOWNTOWN AFTER DARK

Going downtown after dark? Run through this checklist before you head out for the night!

Is my phone charged? Dead battery = no way to call for a ride or find friends if you get separated.

Do I trust the people I'm going out with not to ditch me? There's safety in numbers, so stick with a group that will stick together. No friend left behind!

How am I getting home? If you're partying, make sure you've got a plan to get home safely once the fun is done.

Do I have a way to pay? Just in case you get separated from friends, or your designated driver can no longer drive, make sure you have a way to pay for a ride home if needed.

Does someone know my plan? Before you head out, tell someone where you're going and when you plan to be back.
