RamRide Night Ops, our safe-ride program, offers student organizations opportunities to volunteer and fundraise. Free rides will be

available to the campus community from 10:00 pm to 3:00 am on Friday and Saturday nights. Download the CSU RamRide app to request your free ride around Fort Collins. **Volunteer**, our RamRide program offers CSU clubs and organizations an opportunity to raise money for their organization while helping RamRide run smoothly. If a club/organization has participants that want to volunteer with RamRide, they will be given up to \$1000 from RamRide to use towards their club/organization's needs.

RamRide Food Ops, our food delivery program, will return in partnership with Rams Against Hunger to offer food deliveries to folks experiencing food insecurity and needing that service. Please visit our website for updates to this program.

RamRide x Lyft, our partnership with Lyft, will continue this year, offering Lyft codes for money off your ride. Be on the lookout for these codes, which will be

announced on our Instagram various nights throughout the semester! RamRide Secure, our transportation security program, will continue this year,


